Founded in 1876, Trondhjems Skøiteklub is one of Norway's oldest skating clubs – and today, one of its most active and ambitious. With more than 200 members and over 40 competitive skaters, our community stretches from young children stepping onto the ice for the very first time to elite athletes competing at national and international level. Our skaters compete at national championships and international competitions across Europe.

We are now looking for a new Head Coach or Coach to lead and inspire this journey.

We are searching for someone who combines strong technical knowledge with warmth, leadership and vision – a coach who can develop athletes, strengthen our coaching culture, and create an environment where skaters grow not only in performance, but in confidence, passion and love for the sport.

You won't be doing this alone. You'll lead our figure skating program across all levels alongside an established coaching team – one other permanent coach, several part-time coaches, and our assistant coaches. You'll set seasonal training plans, mentor coaches, guide skaters through the Norwegian Skating Federation's test and competition pathway, and be a familiar face to our parents and the wider Norwegian skating community.

A meaningful part of the role is creative: choreographing competition programs and co-planning TSK's annual ice show.

- Have experience with figure skating coaching up to junior level and want to contribute to both grassroots and competitive development
- Lead with warmth as well as standards.
- Have experience with competitions and official skating tests
- Are passionate about developing children and young athletes
- Work well in teams
- Create motivation, confidence and joy on the ice
- Have strong communication and collaboration skills and fluent in either Norwegian, Swedish, Danish, or English
- Have excellent planning skills and comfortable balancing both coaching and administrative responsibilities
- Have experience with choreography and program creation
- Have international experience as a skater or as a coach
